Varicose veins are enlarged veins that are swollen and raised above the surface of the skin which occur due to a weakening in the vein walls and valves. They can look dark purple or blue and have a lumpy, bulging and/or twisted, rope like appearance. Those who suffer from varicose veins are likely to complain of their legs feeling heavy, swollen, tired, restless, and achy.

Varicose veins are usually caused by insufficiency of the superficial venous system. They develop when valves in the veins (that facilitate blood flow back to the heart) stop functioning properly. As a result, blood pools in the veins and causes them to get larger. These bulging veins cause symptoms resulting in pain, edema, skin discoloration, and even ulceration—a condition known as chronic venous insufficiency or venous reflux disease. Contributing factors include age, gender, heredity, obesity, pregnancy and standing occupations.



Tiny red or blue bursts on your legs are spider veins. They are the result of dilated venous capillaries that fill with blood and become visible. They are frequently seen on the thighs around the knees on the calves and at the ankles.

For the treatment of spider veins, each patient receives an individualized treatment regimen tailored to his/her needs using sclerotherapy and other treatments.

All procedures are performed on an outpatient basis in The Vein Center at KDMC under local anesthesia. There is virtually no down time and recovery is typically rapid. Most patients return to normal activity immediately.
